## ORDINANCE No.19.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF SOUTH HUNTINGDON, WESTMORELAND COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA, AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING AN INCREASE IN THE INDEBTEDNESS OF THE TOWNSHIP OF SOUTH HUNTINGDON, IN THE AMOUNT OF SIXTEEN THOUSAND (\$16,000.00) DOLLARS, BY PROVIDING FOR THE ISSUANCE AND DELIVERY OF A TEMPORARY INDEBTEDNESS NOTE IN SAID AMOUNT FOR THE PURPOSE OF PROVIDING FUNDS FOR CAPITAL EXPENDITURES FOR THE PURCHASE OF A GRADER, AND FIXING THE FORM, DATE, INTEREST RATE, AND MATURITY PROVISIONS OF SAID NOTE.

WHEREAS, it is necessary that the indebtedness of the Township of South Huntingdon, Westmoreland County, Pennsylvania, be increased by the amount of Sixteen Thousand (\$16,000.00) Dollars, for the purpose of capital expenditure for the purchase of a grader, and,

WHEREAS, the Department of Internal Affairs of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, has determined that the above amount of indebtedness will not exceed the Non-electoral Debt limitation fixed by the Constitution, and has issued a statement to that effect to the Township of South Huntingdon,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED AND ENACTED, and it is hereby ordained and enacted by the Township of South Huntingdon, Westmoreland County, Pennsylvania, as follows:

- 1. That the indebteness of the Township of South Huntingdon be and the same is hereby increased in the amount of Sixteen Thousand (\$16,000.00) Dollars for the purpose of capital expenditure for the purchase of a grader.
- 2. That said indebtedness shall be evidenced and secured by a temporary indebtness note in the principal amount of SIXTEEN THOUSAND (\$16,000.00) DOLLARS, dated September 7th,1963, payable to Western Pennsylvania National Bank, Smithton office, its successors and assigns as follows:

"Three thousand two hundred (\$3200.00) Dollars on the first day of September, 1964, and a like and equal amount on the same day of each and every September in the years 1965 to 1968, inclusive, together with interest at the rate of three and one-half ( $3\frac{1}{2}\%$ ) per cent per amount on the unpaid balance of the principal, with the privilege of paying all or any additional part of the principal debt on any installment payment date, no such payment, however, to alter the amount of the aforesaid annual payments of principal".

- 3. The said temporary indebtedness note shall be substantially in the form annexed hereto, made part hereof, and marked Exhibit "A".
- 4. The period of usefullness of the grader to be purchased with the proceeds of said indebtedness note is at least 10 years.
- 5. The said temporary indebtedness note is hereby declared a general obligation of the Township of South Huntingdon, and shall pledge its full faith and credit.
- 6. The temporary indebtedness note shall be executed in the name and under the corporate seal of the Township of South Huntingdon, by the President of Board of Supervisors and attested by the Secretary, and the Secretary is hereby authorized to deliver said note to WESTERN PENNSYLVANIA NATIONAL BANK, Smithton, Pa. and receive payment therefor on behalf of the Township, provided that no amount less than the face value of the note, with accrued interest to date of delivery, shall be taken in payment thereof.
- 7. ALL ordinances and parts of ordinances conflicting with the provisions of the Ordinance are hereby repealed insofar as not in accordance herewith.

Temporary Indebtedness note.

\$16,000.00

7 Sept.1963.

For value received the Township of South Huntingdon, Westmoreland County, Pennsylvania, a municipal corporation created by and existing under the laws of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, promises to pay WESTERN PENNSYLVANIA NATIONAL BANK, Smithton office, its successors or assigns, in lawful money of the United States of America, the sum of SIXTEEN THOUSAND (\$16,000.00) DOLLARS, payable as follows:

Three thousand two hundred (\$3200.00) Dollars on the first day of September, 1964, and a like and equal amount on the same day of each and every September, in the years 1965 to 1968 inclusive, together with interest at the rate of three and one-half ( $3\frac{1}{2}\%$ ) per cent per annum on the unpaid balance of the principal, with the privilege of paying all or any additional part of the principal debt on any installment date, no such payment, however, to alter the amount of the aforesaid annual payments of principal.

This Temporary Indebtedness Note is issued by the Township of South Huntingdon, for valid capital expenditures for the purchase of a grader, in accordance with Article VII-A added to the Municipal Borrowing Law of Pennsylvania, approved Sept. 8,1959, and Section 701-A of Act No.740 of the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, approved December 22,1959, and pursuant to an Ordinance of the Township of South Huntingdon, duly enacted by the Township Supervisors, on 7 Sept.1963, duly recorded and published in the manner provided by law, and in accordance with the sworn debt statement of authorized officers appearing of record in the Department of Internal Affairs of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, at Harrisburg.

It is hereby certified that every requirement of law affecting the issuance hereof, has been duly complied with; that provision has been made for the payment of installments of interest and principal hereof as they become due, and that the total amount of the debt of the Township of South Huntingdon including the aggregate amount of this Temporary Indebtedness note does not exceed two percentum (2%) of the last preceding assessed valuation of the taxable property in the Township and that this Temporary Indebtedness Note and the debt created thereby are within every debt and other limit prescribed by the Constitution and laws of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, and that for the prompt and full payment of all of the obligations hereof, the entire faith, credit, taxing power and resources of the Township of South Huntingdon are thereby irrevocably pledged.
